The Open Internet Vs. Net Neutrality and the Free Internet Sep 03 2021 The terms net neutrality, free Internet, and open Internet are not synonymous but rather point to three different ways of construing the principle of nondiscrimination in the treatment of Internet traffic. Net neutrality protects freedom from discrimination among types or sources of Internet traffic, without regard to any competing interests or countervailing considerations.
